

PILGRIMS OF HOPE MESSAGE FROM PROVINCIAL SUPERIOR

As we are in this sacred Jubilee Year 2025, Pope Francis, as he declared the Jubilee year, exhorted us to be “Pilgrims of Hope” in a world wounded by war, pandemic, and climate crisis. This extraordinary grace period, which began with the opening of the Holy Door at St. Peter’s Basilica on Christmas Eve 2024, invites us to deepen our missionary charism as followers of St. Anthony Mary Claret and sons of the Immaculate Heart of Mary.

Pope Francis declared in his papal bull “*Spes Non Confudit*” (Hope Does Not Disappoint) that hope must be the foundation of our Christian witness. As Claretians in India, we are uniquely positioned to be bearers of this hope to our people. Our charism calls us to serve and build the Church with the ministry of the Word, proclaiming the Kingdom of God, and also to do whatever is urgent, necessary, and timely, making us natural ambassadors of the jubilee hope.

The theme “Pilgrims of Hope” resonates deeply with our Claretian identity. Like our founder, St. Claret, we are called to be pilgrims who journey with God’s people, carrying the flame of hope wherever our mission takes us: from the urban parishes to remote rural communities, from educational institutions to special ministry centres, from homes for the marginalized to hostels run for the underprivileged.

Our Province continues its efforts along the synodal path of the Church and congregational journey of being rooted in Christ and audacious in mission. This Jubilee Year provides us with a providential opportunity to intensify this journey. We participate with the Local Church in celebrating the Jubilee. Some of the specific ways by which we can make this Jubilee Year remarkable and personal are by renewing our Missionary Zeal, and some practical ways for this are regular participation in

the Sacrament of Reconciliation, organizing community pilgrimages to local shrines and holy places, and dedicating time for personal and community spiritual renewal. Another way of making this Jubilee year our own is by focussing on the Ministry of Hope and we do this by focussing our preaching and catechesis on themes of hope and mercy, by reaching out to marginalized communities with renewed compassion, and by strengthening our ministry among youth, families, and the elderly. As we find a widening gulf in the social fabric of the Indian society today, we can also be Pilgrims of Hope by working for Fraternal Unity. Some ways by which we can do this is by strengthening the bonds within our Claretian community through regular sharing and prayer, fostering inter-religious dialogue and ecumenical relationships, and by building bridges of understanding across social divides.

This Jubilee Year is not merely a calendar event but a Kairos moment – God’s appointed time for renewal and mission. Let us grow in faith, hope, and charity, cultivating these special fruits during this Jubilee Year, while simultaneously becoming more audacious in our missionary outreach.

May the Immaculate Heart of Mary, our Mother, under whose protection we live and minister, guide us as we journey together as Pilgrims of Hope. Let us allow this Jubilee grace to transform not only our personal lives but our entire ministerial presence, making us more effective instruments of God’s mercy and hope for the people we serve.

May I wish you a happy Independence Day and the Assumption of the Blessed Virgin Mary.


participating the orientation sessions and interactive dynamics; the liturgy was well celebrated and appreciated. It was a day of learning and bonding in faith for the youth of the parish.
