Our Social Ministries in Care of the People of God

Our Founder, St. Anthony Mary Claret, was a champion of the poor and socially afflicted as the Archbishop of Santiago in Cuba. His charism continues to inspire us in taking up ministries for the uplift of the people, especially those at different types of peripheries in the society.

Claretian Province of Bangalore is spread across various states of India and is engaged in different social ministries. During this season when we celebrate the Birth of our Saviour, we highlight some of such ministries.

Sumanahalli, Bengaluru: At Sumanahalli in Bengaluru, together with many collaborators we



care for those affected by leprosy and other disabilities. Their treatment, follow-up medication, education, rehabilitation, job placement and housing facility, etc. is part of the project supported by many generous and good hearted people.

Mukti, Tenali: We strive to impart quality and affordable education, especially to the

economically weaker underprivileged and sections of the society. Our education ministry ranges from educating children from the remotest hamlets to the semi urban areas. We run schools and hostels for the education of tribal students and help them standout in the society. We have a special Residential School for Tribal Children at Tenali in Andhra Pradesh.





Sneha Jyothi Centre, Athani: Care and rehabilitation of visually challenged is another important

ministry we undertake. Our Sneha Jyothi Centre at Athani in Belagavi district of Karnataka has been rendering yeomen service to the visually impaired children Karnataka. The vision rehabilitate these children through proper education has already bearing fruits been as most of them get into government jobs. Besides their education, various extracurricular activities like singing, music, orchestra, painting, etc. help them to grow in selfconfidence and become independent.



Project Vision, Tumkuru: Through Project Vision initiative we have gone further in creating



global awareness about the eye donation and care and rehabilitation of the visually impaired. The Project Vision rural campus at Arasapura in Tumkur district has initiated various activities for the care of the people affected with different disabilities, especially children. The Centre, in collaboration with many likeminded people takes up various awareness programme and provides facilities like Eye Clinic, Music Therapy, Daycare for children with disabilities, empowering rural women through tailoring unit and responding to the needs of people during disasters.



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Hope Recovery Centre, Belagavi: Addiction to alcohol and drugs is another major disturbing evil in our society. Through our Hope Recovery Centre at Belagavi, we care for those affected by this social evil. A spacious green and healthy campus has helped in treating and rehabilitating thousands of affected from various walks of lives.



Support Centre, Belagavi & Bengaluru: In spite of the modern developments and facilities, we have a lot of people in the society who are uncared for and neglected due to illness or



old age. Through our Support Care Centres at Bengaluru and Belagavi, we take care of the terminally ill, especially the HIV affected. Being loved accepted, cared for and makes their lives more meaningful.

Gandhiji Health and Development Centre, Barwadih: Health is wealth, but many do not have access to it and where available, many cannot afford it. Through our Gandhiji Health and Development Centre at Barwadih in Jharkhand, we provide affordable healthcare to thousands of rural people.
