Through our social activities, we empower individuals and families and through education, apart from the academic excellence, we envision transformative journey of individuals in forming future leaders and entrepreneurs.

Opportunities Beyond Abilities: At Sneha Jothi Centre Athani, we strive to empower especially the visually challenged individuals to turn their belief into action through compassion, training and community support. Thus bridging the gap between ability and opportunity to be independent and self-reliant.



A Home with Hope: Mukti Society, Tenali, stands as a beacon of hope and human dignity for the indigenous Yanadi community in Andhra Pradesh – a community that has faced generations of poverty, social exclusion, and limited access to basic human rights. True to the spirit of the Claretian mission, Mukti aims at liberation through love, education and empowerment. The very name ‘Mukti’ signifies freedom – freedom from ignorance, hunger and social neglect.



Dreams beyond the Challenges: The Claretians have long recognized that education is the key to transforming lives of the marginalized. With Barwadih and Barikhajuri missions in Daltonganj diocese in Jharkhand, our commitment is visible through Hindi and English Medium schools, which provide accessible, value-based education to the children in their own surroundings. These schools lay a strong foundation for literacy and learning in communities where opportunities are often limited.

Yet, the Claretians’ most impactful initiative lies in their evening tuition classes for government school-going children at Ladgain Barwadih. Many of these students face challenges such as overcrowded classrooms, lack of individual attention, and limited support at home. By freely opening the doors of our school in the evenings, the Claretians create a nurturing environment where children receive personalized guidance, strengthen their basics, and build confidence in subjects that often hold them back.



A Beacon of Hope in the Peripheries: St. Claret High School, Basuregadi stands as a powerful testimony to the Claretian mission of transforming lives in the peripheries. The school has become a hope for families whose children might otherwise be left without education. For many, the school is a safe place while their parents go out to work. We accept them as they are and walk patiently with them toward growth.

A Milestone in Growth and Vision: St. Claret College, Autonomous, marked a significant milestone in its institutional journey with the inauguration and blessing of the new Annex Block on 24 October 2025.
